Leadership Development:

In the fall, we had one Team West National Leadership Training session. The Professional Development committee did a great job organizing it. We had about 40 Alumni attend.

The Professional Development committee has been tasked to create a survey for colligate Brothers to find out their expectation of their national officers and what we could be doing better.

Chapter Management:

35 out of 39 chapters (~90%) are on target to become Accredited Chapters

Awards:

We had 37 chapters (95%) of the 39 chapters in the province nominate a chapter COY.

The regional selection committees mostly included non-district directors, allowing for involvement of additional brothers. The provincial awards committee and RVPs are currently promoting participation in the end of the year awards.

LEAD School:

The province had 36 of its collegiate chapters attend the Newport Beach LEAD School plus many alumni chapters from the province in attendance. The total attend was around 600 Brothers which is the biggest LEAD since its inception.

The province hosted Dress Down, which rose over \$600 for the Leadership Foundation and \$600 for St. Jude.

Provincial Conference:

Planning for the provincial conference is going well. Presenters have been assigned and the needed preparations for the council meeting are almost set. The theme of this year's banquet is Mardi Gras.

Expansion:

A number of surrounding universities in the Northwest Region have been identified as potential expansion opportunities.

The colony at UC Santa Cruz is going strong. They have had very successfully events and are looking to be installed in June or early next fall.

The colony at UC Santa Barbara continues to build in numbers and has a goal of getting installed by year-end 2010.

There are new colony prospects on the following campus: University of Hawaii at Manoa, CSU Dominguez Hills, and Cal State San Marcos.

Bay Area Regional Vice President Report Sanjay Trivedi

Status of Region:

Overall the region has is doing well. Each chapter has a strong recruiting strategy to attract, retain and grow their membership to develop strong leaders. In the fall term so far we have initiated over 45 brothers. Our chapter's leadership teams have a strong vision of where they want the chapter to be over the short and long term. We had 5 out of 6 chapters nominate a Collegian of the Year as well as attend the Fall LEAD School in Newport Beach, CA. The pledges at Rho Chapter in U.C. Berkeley presented a great professional event which brought brothers from nearly each chapter in the region to listen to top executives speak on their experiences managing Bay Area Sport teams. Inter chapter events are on the rise as brothers come together to support one another and leverage our local Deltasig network. At least 5 out of 6 chapters are expected to be accredited chapters within CMP.

Accomplishments:

With the implementation of the Bay Area Region Face book page local Deltasig's are better informed of local, regional and provincial events. In an effort to increase Alumni Retention and develop our leadership pool, with the help of the Regional Leadership Team, we've been presenting alumni volunteer opportunities to collegiate brothers to aid in their continued leadership development. The team has also been presenting Risk management workshops for their chapters.

Future Goals:

- By the next Provincial Council Meeting we will have all chapters meeting and exceeding the Accreditation level in CMP.
- All chapters to nominate and submit applications for Collegian of the Year
- At least two chapters to submit for each award category.
- Revamp Santa Clara Silicon Valley Alumni Chapter.
- Continue to educate new alumni on volunteer opportunities to increase alumni retention.

Expansion:

We currently have one colony in the region the Alpha Lambda Phi colony at U.C. Santa Cruz, CA. The colony has been progressing very well; the group has held numerous professional and service events and should exceed the required number of events needed. They are well under way in meeting the requirements and we are targeting an installation date towards the end of May or early June of the spring term.

Disciplinary Issues:

Overall we do not have any major issues in the region. The chapters have been working on prior initiatives to increase pledge retention and overall membership numbers in our smaller chapters and strengthen their overall chapters.

Upcoming Events:

The region (Delta Omicron Chapter) will be holding Brotherhood Games on Saturday, April 17th, 2010 where chapters from both the Sierra Nevada Region and Bay Area Region compete for the coveted Brother Jimmy Yip Brotherhood cup. The region (Zeta Tau and Rho Chapters) also be hosting Western Regional Initiation for the Bay Area Region and Sierra Nevada Region on Saturday, April 23, 2010.

Status of Region:

Coming Together As One

The region is cruising on becoming a cohesive, brotherly region. All chapters have a DD to include our alumni chapters. We had our first Regional Conference in October 2009 with representation from each chapter for the very first time. Chapters are also starting to conduct joint events such as Alpha Nu and Mu Chi participating in a community service event last November and Mu Rho and Nu Phi attending a professional event in November. Our regional alumni relations committee meets again in mid January to start recruiting the 3,000 inactive alumni in our region. We also launched a regional facebook page announcing chapter events and bringing us even closer together.

Initiation Ceremonies

Same two chapters (Mu Rho and Mu Chi) continue to conduct initiation as requested with a few tweaks here and there. Alpha Nu has substantially increased its performance this past term. Alpha Rho has much work to do, but now open to listening to members outside their chapter for improvement. Nu Phi continues to do well.

Awards

Rocky Mountain region took home several provincial and national awards this past year. This region has come a long way and are enjoying their deserved awards. We are working towards awards next term with guidance from our regional awards chair.

Nu Phi

Nu Phi had some significant struggles this past fall with participation, meeting national guidelines, and recruiting 4 pledges and initiating only 2. I spent significant amount of time on the phone with the DD and visited the chapter 3 to 4 times fall of 2009. The DD did step down at the end of the term as their impact to the chapter was ineffective. A new DD will be assigned shortly. This chapter will be a focus of time this semester and next. The majority of the members graduate this spring.

Alpha Nu

Alpha Nu had its struggles with low membership, but was able to bounce back with a big pledge class. The new DD this past fall discovered that only a few members were conducting the majority fo the work while the others had little knowledge of what to do. This chapter is on the quarter system and will take advantage of Winter quarter to regroup and educate each member and officer the roles and responsibilities of each. The DD and myself will be working closely with this chapter.

Desert Mountain Regional Vice President Report David Glanzrock

Status of Region:

Starting off, the Desert Mountain Region encountered several road blocks as we continue to strive for excellence within our region. Starting in August of 2009, we had to go back to the basics with each chapter in the Region as a lack of leadership and involvement left most chapters adrift with discipline, risk management, and morale issues. Many of these roadblocks have been overcome, education and direction from the leadership of the region have been the key to these issues. LEAD School attendance for the Region has been at an all time high with Newport, and we expect a large turnout for El Paso this Spring, and Phoenix, in the fall. All chapters have at least 10 people registered for the LEAD in El Paso. We are adjusting to the new CMP, and by establishing conference calls, one for collegiate chapter president's, the other for District Directors, we have been able to overcome part of the geographic separation that we have to deal with within our large region.

The Desert Mountain Region is on the right track. The most important thing for these chapters to continue on the right track is for sustained direction from District Directors and their RVP. The training of volunteer leaders is essential in this region especially of District Directors. We need to do a better job of retaining our brotherhood once brothers graduate from their respective schools.

Accomplishments:

I am very proud to say that every chapter has a District Director that has been present and involved in the chapters, who are available to assist each chapter. District Director and Volunteer Leader education continues to be a top priority of the Region. Due to the vast geographic area of the Desert Mountain Region, bi-weekly conference calls have been established for collegiate chapter presidents, and for District Directors in order to educate, inform, and increase communication within the Region.

We are currently implementing a Recruitment Boot Camp to be rolled out to all the chapters in the Region in the fall of 2010. The first such boot camp was conducted in January of 2010 for the Zeta Omega Chapter.

Awards are something that the Desert Mountain Region has struggled with for many years. We are currently implementing an awards training program, and several alumni to help guide and assist the chapters in filling out their award applications.

The first ever Desert Mountain Regional Leadership training will take place on the campus of Arizona State University at the end of March. We are very excited to have a dedicated leadership training for our collegiates and alumni, and a time and place to collaborate and strengthen the bonds of the region.

The first Regional Initiation in the Desert Mountain in 3 years will happen this April in Flagstaff, AZ, with 4 chapters putting in a bid to host the event. We expect 100% of the chapters to travel to Flagstaff and participate in the event with the Grand President presiding over the initiation.

All chapters within the region are eager to move their chapters forward in the same direction. They are excited to have hands-on District Directors and direction from alumni within the fraternity. I am very proud of how far the chapters in the Region have come, and am more excited to see where we will all go together in the future.

Future Goals:

1. Increased Participation in Delta Sigma Pi Awards Program
2. Increased Participation in National Delta Sigma Pi events
3. Implement a Regional Community Service Event
4. Establish Alumni Chapters In Tucson, AZ and Las Cruces, New Mexico
5. Explore expansion opportunities in the region
6. Retain more graduating seniors in alumni chapters and for volunteer positions

Expansion:

The Desert Mountain Region has several opportunities for expansion of both collegiate and alumni chapters in New Mexico and Arizona. Increased communication and leadership development will be the key in any new collegiate expansion projects in the region. Geographic isolation continues to be a large factor in the lack of expansion efforts of the region. Alumni chapter prospects are high for Tucson, AZ, we are actively looking for a leadership base in that area to establish and maintain an alumni chapter there.

Disciplinary Issues:

South Pacific Regional Vice President Report Matt Temple

Status

Accomplishments

The region has a Facebook group and a Google calendar. Each has proven to be valuable resources in reaching out to Alumni and Collegiate alike.

An Area Conference and Case Competition was held and sponsored by Target on Saturday, January 30 on the campus of Loyola Marymount University. Target generously donated \$4,000 to the Leadership Foundation. Of the monies donated, \$3,600 was awarded to the winners of the Case Competition. The remaining funds were retained by the Leadership Foundation.

Western Provincial Alumni Development Committee Report

Western Province Alumni Initiatives

1. Grow alumni chapters in numbers - make sure that every graduating alumni is aware of an alumni chapter in their area (if there isn't one, let's talk about starting one)
2. Develop alumni chapters so they can start applying for awards and interacting with collegiate chapters
3. Develop new alumni into National Leaders / enforce the importance in giving back (Leadership Foundation)
4. Get together a focus group of collegians who are graduating and learn what they're looking for in an alumni chapter and what would help/ encourage them to stay active after graduation
5. Put together a committee of alumni chapter members to learn about their goals and initiatives for this year (best practices, etc)
6. Have a competition among alumni chapters to see who can gain the most new members, who can have the largest events, who can get the oldest Deltasig to attend an event, etc. (funnier awards/competition done at a provincial)
7. Set up larger events for National Alumni Day and Founders Day so that alumni chapters are working together with collegiate chapters
8. Work with the host alumni chapter to ensure that they have planned an alumni event or at least plan on playing host for every LEAD and provincial event
9. Work together with the Professional Development Chair to develop and improve upon the National Volunteer Leadership curriculum and the awareness of National Volunteer Leadership opportunities
10. Encourage alumni chapters to hosts events during college breaks (Winter, Spring, Summer) so that collegians are encouraged to attend events while in college. This allows college students to interact with their future alumni chapters locally or in their respective parts of the country they'll move to after graduation

Western Province Alumni Goals:

1. Have each alumni chapter apply for at least 1 award each year
2. Have a table at each LEAD and provincial with information about alumni chapters, contacts and how to join after you graduate
3. Make sure each alumni chapter has an up to date radius report and is actively reaching out to their alumni to grow memberships
4. Set up a precedent where each alumni chapters helps sponsor a collegiate registration to LEAD/provincial
5. Work with National Committee to send important information down to local alumni chapters

Accomplishments: Over the past 6 months I've been able to start working on several of the above initiatives.

The first initiative is to grow alumni chapters in numbers - make sure that every graduating alumnus is aware of an alumni chapter in their area. With the help of many alumni volunteers we were able to create an alumni information table at the Western Provincial LEAD school in Newport Beach. The purpose of the alumni information table is to hand out alumni chapter contact information to any collegians who are interested and to also capture their contact information and send it to an alumni chapter of their choice. I believe that by having this table at every LEAD school and Provincial LEAD we'll be able to make that transition from collegian to active alumni member smoother.

The second initiative is to get together a focus group of collegians who are graduating and learn what they're looking for in an alumni chapter and what would help/ encourage them to stay active after graduation. We have an alumni roundtable set up for the El Paso Provincial LEAD as one of the sessions. I won't be able to attend this year so Justin Cranmer has agreed to lead the roundtable in my absence. My goal is to gain some valuable insight from the collegians and alumni who attend the roundtable such as:

1. What value added services/programs could DSP provide to make staying involved as alumni worthwhile?
2. What makes alumni who are involved stay involved?
3. What events, processes, outreach, etc. currently in place are working and what have alumni chapters (or the fraternity as a whole) done that has not worked?
4. Would including programs for significant others/families make a difference in retention?
5. How can we be proactive instead of constantly reactive, especially when it comes to alumni?

I want to take this feedback and work to improve our alumni chapters, alumni retention and education about alumni programs to both collegians and alumni members.

The third initiative was to put together a committee of alumni chapter members to learn about their goals and initiatives for this year (best practices, etc). We were able to do this in the fall; however there was minimal alumni chapter presence and

participation. I am working on a better way to do this in the future. I believe the insight we could pull from successful alumni chapter in our province would be very valuable.

Future Goals: My future goals are to start working on the above initiatives that have not been touched upon. I'd also like to establish a functioning Western Provincial Alumni Development committee.

National Update: I am actively involved in the National Alumni Development Committee. I am currently the leader for the Alumni Development Strategic Goal #1 (Increase retention and participation of newly graduated alumni Brothers. As a benchmark, the average university alumni retention rate is approximately 18%.) and part of the team for the Alumni Development Strategic Goal # 3 (Identify target areas for new alumni chapter development and cultivate chapters within those areas, in addition to strengthening our current franchised chapters.) My goal is to take the work that is done at the national committee level and bring more success to the Western Province.

At this point we have had one conference call and Rochelle Siegrist is working hard to make sure that all our Alumni Development Strategic Goals are met.

Committee Members: I have set up one Alumni Development committee call with the presidents of each of the alumni chapters in the Western Province. There was a very low response and attendance on this conference call. At this point there is no active Alumni Development committee in our province.

SUMMARIZATION OF THE PROPOSAL/RESOLUTION

Create a new Region by splitting the Desert Mountain Region.

- Include Clark County, NV and the entire state of Arizona in the Grand Canyon Region.
- Include El Paso, TX and the entire state of New Mexico in the Desert Mountain Region.
